*** Adults who were baptized Catholic but did not complete their initiation through Confirmation, and/or First Eucharist.

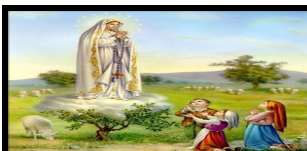
